This fence appliqué is a fun way to let your friends and family know you're thinking of them. Mix and match or make a two sided ornament for the family who loves both gardening and American football! It's quirky and fun.

Yarn Craft: Crochet
Skill Level: Easy ✓ ✓ ✓ ✓
Project Type: Ornament
Length: 3 inches
Height: 3 inches
Gauge: 5 sc & 5 rows = 1"

Supplies:

Yarn: Medium worsted weight (4)
 White – Remnant
 Tan – Remnant
 Brown – Remnant
 Pink – Remnant
 Yellow – Remnant
 Lime Green – Remnant

Hook: F / 5 / 3.75 mm
 C / 2 / 2.75 mm

Needle: Yarn needle to sew

Pins: Straight Pins

Board: Cardboard to pin appliqué to stiffen

Brads: White brads (craft store scrapbook dept) (optional)

Notes:

This pattern provides directions for making the narrow fence (D fence pictured here). The wider fence (flower garden pictured here) is 5 stitches wider on the horizontal supports.



Special Stitch:

Picot = Ch 3, sl st in 3rd ch from hook.

Abbreviations:

ch = chain

dc = double crochet

hdc = half double crochet

picot = picot

rnd – round

row = row

sc = single crochet

sl st = slip stitch

st = stitch

sts = stitches

tr = treble (triple) crochet

instructions = repeat the instructions written between the asterisks the number of times indicated after the second asterisk.

About Picket Fences

Picket fences are vertical boards (pickets) attached to two horizontal strips (stretchers). The pointed or sloped top of the pickets helps rain water run off the boards extending the life of the pickets.

The picket fence is named after "General George Picket" who marched his troops in a line during the US Civil War.

FREE Fence Ornament – D Fence

FENCE INSTRUCTIONS

Vertical Slat (Make 5)

Hook: F

Tan

□ Ch 13

□ **Row 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook, 11 sc. (12)

□ **Row 2:** Ch 1, turn. 12 sc. (12)

□ **Row 3:** Ch 3, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, ch 1, sl st in corner at base of st. (this forms a pointed picket fence slat). Finish off. Leave a long tail for sewing.

Horizontal Supports (Make 2)

For a longer board, increase by 5 sts.

Hook: F

Tan

□ Ch 17

□ **Row 1:** Sl st in 2nd ch from hook, 15 sl st. (16) Finish off. Leave a long tail for sewing.



Stitches:

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Gauge: 5 sc & 5 rows = 1 inches

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FREE Fence Ornament – D Fence (continued)

D INSTRUCTIONS

Hook: C

White

- Ch 18.** Join with a sl st.
- Row 1:** Ch 4, sl st in 3rd ch from hook. Hdc at the base of ch 4 made at the beginning of this row. 5 hdc. In next st work hdc, picot, 2 hdc. 11 hdc. Hdc in the base of the ch 4 made at the beginning of the row. Join with a sl st just below the picot. Finish off. Leave a long tail for sewing.

FOOTBALL INSTRUCTIONS

Hook: C

Brown

- Ch 3.** Join with a sl st.
- Row 1:** Ch 1, 8sc in ring formed in previous step. Join with a sl st. (8)
- Row 2:** Ch 1, sc inc, hdc. In next st work dc, tr, dc. Hdc. Sc inc. Hdc. In next st work dc, tr, dc. Hdc. Join with a sl st. Finish off. Leave a long tail for sewing. (14)

White

- Sew in football threads



ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

- Pin the two horizontal fence boards an inch apart from each other to a piece of cardboard.
- Pin the five vertical slats on top of the horizontal boards equal distance apart making sure the outside boards align to the ends of the horizontal boards. The pointed ends of the vertical slats should all be pointed in the same direction.
- Starch the pieces. Allow to dry.
- Using one tail from each of the horizontal boards, sew the slats to the board. This is a place holder so that you can move the pickets around after removing pins.
- Remove pins.
- Weave in tails of pickets. At the top of the picket, weave the tail so it fills in the hole in the point.



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FREE Fence Ornament – D Fence (continued)

- ❑ Sew in the remaining tails of the horizontal board making sure the pickets are sewn securely.
- ❑ Weave in ends and cut off tails.
- ❑ Pin the letter D and the football to the fence.
- ❑ Sew the letter D and the football to the fence using left over tails. Make sure you don't sew all the way through so the backside of the fence looks clean.
- ❑ Weave in ends and cut off tails.
- ❑ Pin and restarch if desired.

FENCE INSTRUCTIONS

Vertical Slat (Make 5)

Hook: F

Tan

□ Ch 13

□ **Row 1:** Sc in 2nd ch from hook, 11 sc. (12)

□ **Row 2:** Ch 1, turn. 12 sc. (12)

□ **Row 3:** Ch 3, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, ch 1, sl st in corner at base of st. (this forms a pointed picket fence slat). Finish off. Leave a long tail for sewing.

Horizontal Board (Make 2)

For a longer board, increase by 5 sts.

Hook: F

Tan

□ Ch 17

□ **Row 1:** Sl st in 2nd ch from hook, 15 sl st. (16) Finish off. Leave a long tail for sewing.



Stitches:

Ch = chain

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FREE Fence Ornament – Flower Garden (continued)

FLOWER GARDEN INSTRUCTIONS

Flower (make 3)

Pink (or yellow)

- ❑ **Rnd 1:** Ch 5, sl st in 5th ch from hook (foundation ch) (1 petal made).
Ch 4, sl st in foundation ch
4 times. (4 petals made).
Finish off. Leave a long tail for sewing.
- ❑ Add brad to center of flower.

Middle Stem (make 1)

Lime Green

- ❑ **Row 1:** Ch 7, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, 1 sl st. (base stem and first leaf made)
Ch 3, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, 3 sl st. (top stem made)
Ch 3, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, 1 sl st. (second leaf made)
3 sl st. (base stem made)
Finish off. Leave a long tail for sewing.



Right Stem (make 1)

Lime Green

- ❑ **Row 1:** Ch 7, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, 1 sl st. (base stem and leaf made)
Ch 3, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, 1 sl st. (top of stem made)
5 sl st. (remainder of stem made)
Finish off. Leave a long tail for sewing.

Left Stem (make 1)

Lime Green

- ❑ **Row 1:** Ch 6, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, 2 sl st. (stem made)
Ch 3, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, 1 sl st. (leaf made)
2 sl st. (remainder of stem made)
Finish off. Leave a long tail for sewing.



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FREE Fence Ornament – Flower Garden (continued)

ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

- ❑ Pin the two horizontal fence boards an inch apart from each other to a piece of cardboard.
- ❑ Pin the five vertical slats on top of the horizontal boards equal distance apart making sure the outside boards align to the ends of the horizontal boards. The pointed ends of the vertical slats should all be pointed in the same direction.
- ❑ Starch the pieces. Allow to dry.
- ❑ Using one tail from each of the horizontal boards, sew the slats to the board. This is a place holder so that you can move the pickets around after removing pins.
- ❑ Remove pins.
- ❑ Weave in tails of pickets. At the top of the picket, weave the tail so it fills in the hole in the point.
- ❑ Sew in the remaining tails of the horizontal board making sure the pickets are sewn securely.
- ❑ Weave in ends and cut off tails.
- ❑ Pin the stems and flowers to the fence.
- ❑ Sew the stems and flowers to the fence using left over tails. Make sure you don't sew all the way through so the backside of the fence looks clean.
- ❑ Weave in ends and cut off tails.
- ❑ Pin and restarch if desired.



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
