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## **Pig Accessories**

Playing "dress-up" is enjoyable for kids (of all ages). Have a little fun and crochet a few accessories for your pig.

Crochet a medal – embroider Initials in the gold medal to personalize the pig or stitch in "1<sup>st</sup>" to make the pig a prize winner.

Crochet a shirt – mix and match colors. The color can be masculine, feminine or school colors.

Instructions for the letter "A" are included in this section for fans of the University of Arkansas Razorbacks.

**Hook:** H / 8 / 5.0 mm

E / 4 / 3.5 mm C / 2 / 2.75 mm

Needle: Yarn needle

Needle for thread

**Thread:** Thread to sew buttons

**Pins:** Straight pins for pinning things in place

(optional)

**Buttons:** For shirt – 3 per shirt 1 cm or 7/16 inch

Ring: Jump Ring (for medal)

Paper: 5" x 5" decorative paperBrad:Brad with ½"

tine

**Eyelet:** Small eyelet & eyelet setter

Hole Punch: mini-whole punch
Scissors: Scissors to cut paper
Pencil: Pencil for pinwheel

## **SPECIAL STITCHES:**

**NFCSC** = Insert hook into the bottom st of the previous sc, YO pull through one loop on hook, YO and pull through one loop on hook (this is the st that acts as the foundation ch for the next st), YO pull through both loops on hook

## **Pig Accessories - Collar**

This collar is great as a name tag or a medal making your pig a 1<sup>st</sup> place prize winner. Be sure to check the size as you crochet it so that it will fit over the pigs head.

8 sc and 9 rows = 2 inches

Needle: Yarn needle

Ring: Jump Ring (for medal)



## **RIBBON / COLLAR INSTRUCTIONS**

Hook: H BLUF

☐ Ch 41

Row 1: Sc in second ch from hook and in each ch across.

Finish off. Cut yarn leaving a tail for sewing. (40)

Check to see if the ribbon it the right size. Make it longer or shorter if needed. Sew the two ends together.

#### MEDAL INSTRUCTIONS

Hook: E **GOLD** 

☐ Ch 2

same stitch

Rnd 1: 6 sc in second ch from hook. (6)

Rnd 2: Sc inc around. (12)

☐ **Rnd 3:** \*Sc, sc inc\* around. (18)

☐ Finish off. Cut yarn; weave in end.

inc = increase; two stitches in the same stitch

nfcsc = no foundation chain single crochet

 $\square$  Use a remnant of black superfine yarn to embroider a W or  $1^{st}$ , or message of choice.

☐ Attach medal to ribbon/collar with a jump ring.

ch = chain rnd = round dc = double crochet dec = decrease; crochet two stitches together sc = single crochet hdc = half double crochet

## **Pig Accessories - Shirt**

Keep your pig warm with a crocheted shirt. We've used a variegated yarn. Use up your stash or create a custom shirt to match your needs.

8 sc and 9 rows = 2 inches

**Hook:** H / 8 / 5.0 mm **Needle:** Yarn needle

Needle for thread

**Thread:** Thread to sew buttons

**Buttons:** For shirt – 3 per shirt 1 cm or 7/16 inch



### **SHIRT INSTRUCTIONS**

Hook: H

**VERIGATED COLOR** 

Ch 51

Row 1: Sc in second ch from hook,

49 sc. (50)

Check to see if this is the right length. It should go all the way around the pig's belly and overlap a little for the buttons.
You may need to adjust the length to fit your pig.

□ □ □ **Row 2-5:** Ch 1, turn.

Sc across. (50)

The next rows work the leg holes. Check to make sure the shirt will line up with the legs as you go. My pig had about three stitches between the legs. You may need to adjust the count if your legs are closer or farther apart.

□ Row 6: Ch 1, turn. 4 sc. (4)

Row 7: Ch 1, turn. Sc dec, 2 sc. (3)

□ Row 8-9: Ch 1, turn. 3 sc. (3)

☐ Finish off. Cut yarn; weave in end.

☐ Row 10: Go back to rows 6. Skip three stitches. Attach yarn to fourth stitch. Sc in same st. 35 sc. (36)

☐ Row 11: Ch 1, turn. Sc dec, 32 sc, sc dec. (34)

### Stitches: ch = chain

dc = double crochet

dec = decrease; crochet two stitches together

hdc = half double crochet

hdc inc = half double crochet increase; two half double crochet in same stitch

inc = increase; two stitches in the same stitch
nfcsc = no foundation chain single crochet

in sc

rnd = round

sc = single crochet
sc dec = single crochet decrease; single crochet two stitches together
sc inc = single crochet increase; two single crochets in the same stitch
sl et = slip ctitch

Gauge: Hook H & medium worsted weight yarn (4):8 sc and 9 rows = 2 inches

\*instructions\* = repeat the instructions written between the asterisks the number of times indicated after the second asterisk.

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## Pig Accessories – Shirt continued

□ Row 12-13: Ch 1, turn. 34 Sc. (34)

Finish off and weave in ends.

■ **Row 14:** Go back to row 6. Skip four stitches. Attach yarn to fifth stitch. Sc in

same st, 2 sc. (This should be the end of the row.) (3)

□ □ Row 15-16: Ch 1, turn. 3 sc. (3)

Row 17: Ch 1, turn. 3 sc, NFCSC in the same stitch as the last sc, 4 NFCSC, (continue across on row 13), 34 sc, NFCSC in same stitch as last sc, 4 NFCSC, (continue across on row 9), 3 sc. (50)

Row 18: Ch 1, turn. Sc across. (50)

Rows 19-21 form the collar.

Row 19: Ch 1, turn. Working in front loops only, sc dec, 46 sc, sc dec. (48)

Row 20: Ch 1, turn. Working in both loops, sc dec, 44 sc, sc dec. (46)

Row 21: Ch 1, turn. Sc dec, 42, sc dec. Finish off. Cut yarn; weave in end. (44)

Rnds 22-27 form the sleeves. Repeat for each arm hole.

With right side facing, attach yarn to any stitch of the

arm hole.

Rnd 22: Use 17 sc to sc around the arm hole. (That equals one more than four sc per side.) (17)

☐ Rnd 23: Working in the front loops only, sc around. (17)

□ □ □ <u>Rnd 24-27:</u> Sc around. (17)

☐ Finish off. Cut yarn; weave in end.

■ Sew buttons to the right side of the side that will be below the other. The buttons should be small enough to fit through between stitches. No button holes are necessary.

ch = chain

dc = double crochet

dec = decrease; crochet two stitches together

hdc = half double crochet

hdc inc = half double crochet increase; two half double crochet in same stitch

inc = increase; two stitches in the same stitch

nfcsc = no foundation chain single crochet

Gauge: Hook H & medium worsted weight yarn (4):8 sc and 9 rows = 2 inches

rnd = round

row = row

sc = single crochet

sc dec = single crochet decrease; single crochet two stitches together **sc inc =** single crochet increase; two single crochets in the same stitch sl st = slip stitch

## Famous Pigs (just to name a few)

Here is a short list of famous pigs and modifications you can make to the "Pork Chop" pattern.

- 1. **Angry Birds** green pigs with eyes very wide apart.
- 2. Maxwell, the Geico Pig have pig holding paper pinwheels. (pinwheel instructions below)
- 3. **Napoleon** from *Animal Farm* have standing on two back feet.
- 4. Piglet from Winnie the Pooh Give a striped pink shirt and have standing on back two feet.
- 5. **Porky Pig** from *Looney Tunes* blue shirt and red bow tie and have standing on back two feet. Crochet oval eyes in white and black instead of plastic eyes.
- 6. Tusk, the Arkansas Razorbacks mascot is red with white tusks. (instructions below)
- 7. Wilbur from Charlotte's Web give blue collar and gold medal. (instructions in "Pork Chop" pattern.)

Yarn Craft: Crochet Skill Level: Easy ✓ ✓ ✓

**Project Type:** Toy

Gauge: H Hook: Medium worsted

weight (4):

8 sc and 9 rows = 2 inches



Yarn: ARKANSAS RAZORBACK

BURGUNDY: Red Heart Super Saver – Medium (4) – 1 skein SOFT WHITE: Red Heart Super Saver – Medium (4) remnant BLACK: Red Heart Super Saver – Medium (4) – remnant

#### **Razorback Instructions**


Pig and Boar pattern are written in "Pork Chop" pattern available on Yarnovations.com.

- 1. Crochet Boar in BURGUNDY.
- 2. Follow instructions of **Mounted Boar Head** pattern through Row 26.
- 3. Follow instructions of "Pork Chop" starting at Row 23 to end.
- 4. Accent colors (base of feet and nostrils) are BLACK.
- 5. Stitch eyebrows above eyes in BLACK.
- Follow the instructions for the **Shirt** (above) using BLACK yarn and red buttons.
- 7. Follow the instructions for the **Letter "A"** (below).





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## Free Pig Accessories - The Letter "A"

The "A" represents the University of Arkansas. Their mascot is the Razorback (Wild Boar).

### "A" INSTRUCTIONS

Hook: C BURGUNDY

Part 1 Ch 12

**Row 1:** Sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook. 10 sc. (11)

**Row 2:** Ch 12, sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook. 10 sc. (11).

Row 3: Ch 2, dc in first ch of Row 2. Ch 2, sl st in the post (side) of last sc made in Row 1. Sl st in the end. Finish off, weave in ends.

As you weave in the ends, you can sew the Ch 2's from Row 3 together, getting rid of any gaps at the tip of the "A".

## Part 2 Ch 4

**Row 1:** Sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook. 1 sc, 1 sl st. Finish off, leave long tail for sewing.

Sew to Part 1 in the  $6^{th}$  and  $7^{th}$  st from the bottom.

Attach WHITE to any outside st. Row 2: SI st around. Join with a sI st. Finish off, leave a long tail for sewing.

Attach WHITE to the back loop of any st inside the small triangle of the "A".

**Row 3:** In the back loop only, sl st around. Join with a sl st. Finish off, weave in ends.

Pin "A" appliqué to sweater. Sew

to the sweater using tail remaining from Row 2.



Stitches:	<b>Gauge:</b> Hook H & medium worsted weight yarn (4):8 sc and 9 rows = 2 inches
ch = chain	sc = single crochet

dc = double crochet

row = row

st = slip stitch

st = slip stitch

## FREE Pig Accessories - Pinwheel

In a couple of Geico commercials, there is a pig named Maxwell who squeals "Weeeee" as he holds a pinwheel in the wind. Whether your pinwheel represents Max or not, they are just plain fun to make.

## PAPER PINWHEEL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Cut a piece of decorative paper to 5 inches by 5 inches square.
- 2. Cut from the corners to within one inch of the center on the diagonal. (See picture)
- Punch a hole near the edge of each right hand side of corners. (See picture)
- 4. Punch a hole in the center of the paper. (See picture)
- 5. Align all the holes to the center whole (use glue if needed).
- 6. Insert and set eyelet.
- Insert brad through eyelet and into eraser of pencil. (If needed, use a paper piercing tool or the end of a compass to pierce the eraser before pushing the brad into the pencil).
